

NOVEMBER, 2020 Hot Topics

- **September 29, 2020 –**
 - ❖ New centerline markings were applied to roadway at Aviation Way gate.
 - ❖ Replacement light bulb for Beacon was ordered and picked up for future use.
- **October 1, 2020 –**
 - ❖ New paint was applied and new light fixture were installed on the Windsock tower.
 - ❖ PowerPro Equipment dropped off a Hustler mower for Airport Maintenance to demo.
- **October 2, 2020 –**
 - ❖ Installed new tube in Batwing mower tire.
 - ❖ Applied airport name lettering to new Windsock to prep for future use.
- **October 5, 2020 –**
 - ❖ Installed new photocell sensor for Terminal parking lot lights.
 - ❖ Installed new LED light bulb in a Terminal parking lot pole light.
- **October 6, 2020 –**
 - ❖ New “Warning No Trespassing” signs were installed on both the West gate (Washington Lane) and the North gate (RT 30).
 - ❖ Stoltzfus Farm Service Inc. dropped off an Exmark mower for Airport Maintenance to demo.
 - ❖ Monthly Environmental inspections were completed.
 - ❖ USDA arrived at MQS to spray trees infected with Spotted Lantern Flies.
 - ❖ Able Fencing came to MQS to give a quote on completing the Airport Perimeter Fence Project.
- **October 7, 2020 –**
 - ❖ The Airport Manager and 4 Authority Board members completed an 8-hour Aviation Board training session that was hosted by Anthony McCloskey (PENNDOT-BOA) and Reiner Pelzer (AECOM Engineering Company).
- **October 8, 2020 –**
 - ❖ New signs were installed at the handicap parking spots located in the Terminal parking lot.
- **October 9, 2020 –**
 - ❖ A new tire from Martin’s Tire was installed on the rim of the Case tractor.
 - ❖ A New rear tire was installed on the Case tractor.
 - ❖ Little’s John Deere dropped off 2 John Deere mowers for Airport Maintenance to demo.

- **October 12, 2020 –**
 - ❖ Collected semi-annual NPDES Test samples were dropped off at Lancaster Labs.
 - ❖ Dodge Pickup truck's 4wheel drive problem was diagnosed and repaired.
 - ❖ S10 Pickup truck's brakes were diagnosed and repaired.
- **October 13, 2020 –**
 - ❖ The Honda push mower was picked up from Gap Power, and a new engine was installed.
 - ❖ USDA continued tree spraying activities for Spotted Lantern Flies on the North side of the airport.
 - ❖ A repaired tire from Martin's Tire was picked up. It will be used as a spare in the future, if needed.
- **October 14, 2020 –**
 - ❖ New "Stop Here" signs were installed at all three driveway security gates.
 - ❖ New ramp access signs on the pedestrian gates by the Terminal building were installed.
- **October 15, 2020 –**
 - ❖ USDA completed treating trees at MQS that were infected with Spotted Lantern Flies.
- **October 16, 2020 –**
 - ❖ Monthly maintenance was completed on ALL driveway security fence gates.
- **October 19, 2020 –**
 - ❖ New paint was applied to the AWOS tower.
- **October 20, 2020 –**
 - ❖ Monthly PAPI maintenance and inspection were completed.
 - ❖ A vehicle state inspection was completed on the Ford Explorer.
- **October 21, 2020 –** New light bulbs were installed and pole lights around MQS were repaired.
- **October 22, 2020 –**
 - ❖ Semi-annual fire hydrant maintenance was completed on all fire hydrants.
 - ❖ The pole light along Aviation Way that was knocked down, was repaired.
 - ❖ Semi-annual NPDES reports were completed and submitted to the DEP.
- **October 23, 2020 –**
 - ❖ New paint was applied to the Electrical shed building.
- **October 26, 2020 –**
 - ❖ Advanced Geoservices started geotechnical investigation work on the T-Hangar taxi-lanes.
- **October 27, 2020 –**
 - ❖ The Airport Manager was notified by Matt Massiano (Saab, Inc.), that MQS's Federal Contract Tower Benefit Cost Analysis Program application did not qualify for the Federal Contract Tower Program.

- ❖ The Taxiway Charlie airfield directional sign was repaired.
- ❖ The Airport Manager monitored drone operations conducted by a photographer that was shooting aerial photography for Aldi, at the Airport Village Shopping Center.
- ❖ Monthly DEP Storm water inspections for the South Apron were completed.

- ❖ Aircraft Rescue and Fire Fighting (ARFF) shed's propane heat source tank was filled and heater was turned on for cold season.
